General Guidelines for Admission in M.Phil. Program (July 2017)

Programs:CT PET-2017 [for M.Phil.] is applicable to following programmes in full time mode of minimum 1 year duration:

Discipline	Program Nomenclature
Computer Applications	M.Phil. (Computer Applications)
Humanities	M.Phil. (History)
Economics	M.Phil. (Economics)
Management	M.Phil. (Management)

Procedure:

University shall admit M.Phil. students through a two stage process (an Entrance Test and subsequent interview) conducted at the level of University:

Stage I (Entrance Test): An Entrance Test shall be qualifying with qualifying marks as 50%. The syllabus of the Entrance Test shall consist of 50% of research methodology and 50% shall be subject specific. The Entrance Test shall be conducted at the University.

Stage II (Interview): University shall organize an interview where the successful candidates in stage I candidates are required to discuss their research interest/area through a presentation before a duly constituted Department Research Committee. The interview shall also consider the following aspects, viz. whether:

- the candidate possesses the competence for the proposed research;
- the research work can be suitably undertaken at the Institution/College;
- the proposed area of research can contribute to new/additional knowledge.

Selection Criteria:

Stage wise (Entrance and Interview) and Discipline/Program wise merit list will be prepared. Candidates successful in Entrance test (Stage I) will be called for interview (Stage II). The final selection for admission in M.Phil. will be based on the performance in the Interview subject to scoring minimum marks.

Eligibility: Any one of the following

Candidates for admission to the M.Phil. programme shall have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational Institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other

statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions.

A relaxation of 5% of marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC(non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time, or for those who had obtained their Master's degree prior to 19th September, 1991. The eligibility marks of 55% (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark procedures.

Exemption from Entrance Test:

Candidates who has qualified UGC (NET/JRF)/CSIR(NET /JRF)/ICAR(JRF/SRF) Examination/SLET (for Punjab state only) /GATE/GPAT/ICAR or hold Teacher Fellowship are exempted from entrance test.

Centres for Entrance test: CT University, Ludhiana.

Attendance:

University's attendance rules as defined in the Academic and Examination rules for regular programmes shall be applicable.
